


- Established in 1990 as part of the Georgia
 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Act
- Funded by the \$1.00 fee on every new tire sold in the state (Tire Management Fee)
- Fee is collected from tire distributors (effective July 1, 2023)

WHAT IS THE SOLID WASTE TRUST FUND?

Tire Management Fees totaling \$7,628,938
 from the SWTF were available to EPD in
 FY23

- SWTF dollars are used for specific purposes, which include:
 - Scrap tire abatement activities
 - Material recovery and grant administration
 - Waste reduction and litter education
 - Administrative and operational costs
 - Closure of abandoned landfills

Waste Reduction and Litter Education

WHAT IS THE SWTF GRANT PROGRAM?

- Grant program dedicated to furthering the specific purposes of the SWTF
- Includes three grants for local governments:
 - Tire Products (Tire) Grant
 - Scrap Tire Abatement Reimbursement (STAR) Grant
 - Recycling and Waste Diversion (RWD) Grant
- Emphasis on material recovery and waste reduction
- \$3.5 million for FY 2024



ELIGIBILITY

- Counties and municipalities
- Public authorities, agencies, commissions, or institutions
- Compliant with Department of Community Affairs
- No open or unresolved enforcement actions with EPD
- Successful administration of other EPD grant funds (if applicable)



Nonprofit or private organizations are NOT eligible for funding, although eligible applicants may partner/contract with nonprofits or private organizations

TIRE PRODUCTS (TIRE) GRANT

- Focus on projects that support manufacturing and market development for scrap tires and encourage innovation
- \$1 million allocated in FY 2024
- Competitive
- \$250K cap per applicant
- Two project tracks



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TIRE-DERIVED PRODUCTS TRACK

- Projects that utilize TDP instead of conventional or virgin materials
- No match required for this track
- Grant funds will only pay for the difference in price for the direct cost of incorporating the TDP
- Direct cost may include material costs, or specialized services, such as the mixing of TDP



RESEARCH OF NEW AND/OR INNOVATIVE USES TRACK



- Projects that seek to identify innovative uses
- Conduct research, tests, or develop beneficial uses for products derived from scrap tires
- Awarded grant funds may be used for all costs related to research, such as material testing
- A minimum 20% match of the total project cost is required



CITY OF SNELLVILLE

The City of Snellville was awarded \$174,993 to install pour-in-place surfacing at two playgrounds. An estimated 63,750 lbs. of TDP were used.





GA SOUTHERN UNIVERSITY

Georgia Southern University was awarded \$199,838 for a research project.

- Focus on the applicability of ground tire rubber (GTR) in asphalt in Georgia.
- Seeks to identify a higher quantity of GTR for use in asphalt above current industry standards.









CITY OF CEDARTOWN

The City of Cedartown was awarded \$245,337 to install pourin-place surfacing at one playground. An estimated 203,982 lbs. of TDP were used.





LOCAL GOVERNMENT SCRAP TIRE ABATEMENT REIMBURSEMENT (STAR) GRANT

SCRAP TIRE DAY EVENTS Reimburses local governments for the costs of transporting and processing tires collected during scrap tire events.


RIGHT-OF-WAY CLEANUPS Reimburses local governments for the costs of transporting and processing tires collected from city and county right-of-ways.

LOCAL-LED TIRE ABATEMENT Reimburses local governments for hiring a tire abatement contractor.

Noncompetitive


Open all year

Up to \$75K per local government


Tires must be recycled by approved processor

Since the start of the program in FY 2015, 1,370,783 passenger tire equivalents (PTEs) have been removed and recycled statewide.

Local governments have been reimbursed \$3.6 million to cover the costs of removing, transporting, and processing the tires.



RECYCLING AND WASTE DIVERSION GRANT



- Purpose is to reduce solid waste in Georgia, recover valuable materials, support manufacturing, and encourage innovation
- \$2 million allocated FY23 and FY24 each
- Competitive
